FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Why is Union County partnering with the Town of Norwood in Stanly County?

Union County is partnering with the Town of Norwood to access and transfer water from Lake Tillery. In turn, the Town of Norwood will gain new water intake infrastructure and an ongoing revenue stream to support other critical projects.

Is there enough water for drought conditions?

Extensive water modeling of the Yadkin River and Lake Tillery indicates that adequate water is available to support water supply needs, including during drought conditions. Union County also has a Water Use Ordinance that requires reduction in water use by its customers during drought conditions to preserve the water supply.

When will construction begin?

If an Interbasin Transfer (IBT) certificate is issued, Union County and the Town of Norwood will continue additional permitting and design efforts. Construction is anticipated to begin in early 2019.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PUBLIC WORKS EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Our efforts to bring Union County a long-term, sustainable water supply have made significant progress since our last newsletter and we have exciting updates to share with you.

We're pleased to report the NC Department of Environmental Quality issued a record of decision to accept the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) submitted by Union County. The EIS describes the effects that our plan, along with other potential options, will have on the environment. The EIS is used by government agencies to ensure that our proposed solution is the best one for everyone involved.

The acceptance of the EIS will allow Union County to submit a petition to the Environmental Management Commission (EMC) for an interbasin transfer (IBT) from the Yadkin River. Union County is expecting to receive the certificate in early 2017. In short, we're on the right track.

The EMC issued a draft determination on the IBT Certificate and will hold three public hearings in late August and early September so that everyone in Union County and the Town of Norwood can stay up to date and informed on the process. We encourage you to attend the public hearings, ask questions and voice your opinion on the project.

The Town of Norwood has been a tremendous partner throughout this process, and we appreciate their collaboration and contributions over the last four years to make our project a success.

We still have a long way to go but we're proud of the progress we've made in securing a safe and sustainable water supply.
